The white peafowl is a colour mutation of the Indian Blue Peafowl, not albinos!

The lack of colour is determined by pigment and structure of the feather.





With white peafowl their unusual colour is due to a missing pigment.



White Peafowl are the most popular in the UK after the Indian Blue Peafowl.

The White Peafowl is completely white with blue seeing eyes. There is a slight discolouration to the ocelli in the White Peacocks tail.





Both the male and female White peafowl are similar until they are 12 months old. The peacock has slightly longer legs.



White peachicks are born yellow and have blue seeing eyes. Within days they develop white wing tips.



White peachicks are hard to sex. At 12-14 months the peacock will develop feathery coverts.



In common with other members of the Galliformes, the males possess metatarsal spurs or thorns on their legs used during intraspecific territorial fights with other members of their kind.



Peafowl are omnivores and eat mostly plant parts, flower petals, seed heads, insects and other arthropods, reptiles, and amphibians.



They retreat to the shade and security of the woods for the hottest portion of the day.

White peafowl bred to Indian Blue Peafowl
will occasionally hatch a white chick.
